Instruction Manual Fieldbus device - SI unit for DeviceNet® EX250-SDN1 / EX250-SDN1-X102



The intended use of this product is to control pneumatic valves and I/O while connected to the DeviceNet® protocol.

1 Safety Instructions

These safety instructions are intended to prevent hazardous situations and/or equipment damage. These instructions indicate the level of potential hazard with the labels of "Caution," "Warning" or "Danger."

They are all important notes for safety and must be followed in addition to International Standards (ISO/IEC)^{*1)}, and other safety regulations.



	1	Communication connector	Connector for communication signals via DeviceNet® line.
1	2 Power supply connector		Supplies power to the solenoid valve, output block, SI unit and input block.
;	3	Input block connector	Connector for input block.
	4	Output block connector	Connector for solenoid valve or output block etc.
	5	Display window	Displays the status of the SI unit using LED's.
	6	Switch cover	Address and communication speed, etc. are set using the switches inside.
	7	FE terminal	Functional Earth (M3 screw).

5 Wiring

- Wiring should be carried out with the power supply turned OFF.
- Do not route the communication cable near to high voltage cables such as a power cable or high current electrical cable.
- The drain wire should be connected to ground at one point only in the communication network. Grounding should only be made at one point.

5.1 Communication connector

Select appropriate cables to mate with the connector on the SI unit.
 A shielded twisted pair cable for DeviceNet® should be used.

 The maximum cable length depends on the communication speed and the cable type used.

5.1.1 Terminating Resistor

- DeviceNet[®] requires a terminating resistor installed at each end of the main trunk line (not at the end of a drop line).
- The resistor requirements are: 121 Ω , 1% metal film, 1/4 W.


4 Installation

4.1 Installation

M Warning

 Do not install the product unless the safety instructions have been read and understood.

Assembly of the units



Hold the SI unit and the Input / Output blocks together in order to ensure there is no gap between them, while tightening the screws.

Tighten the screws with the specified tightening torque (0.6 N•m).

Assembly Precautions

- Be sure to turn OFF the power supply.
- Check there is no foreign matter inside the SI unit.
- Check there is no damage and no foreign matter stuck to the gasket.
- Tighten the screws with the necessary tightening torque to maintain IP67 enclosure rating.

4.2 Environment

↑ Warning

- Do not use in an environment where corrosive gases, chemicals, salt water or steam are present.
- Do not install in a location subject to vibration or impact in excess of the product specifications.

5.2 Power Supply connector


 Connect a power supply cable to the power supply connector on the SI unit.


- Within the SI unit there are separate power supply lines for the solenoid valves (SV power supply) and for the input block (SW power supply).
- Supply power to each of them, from a single power supply or from dual power supplies.

5.2.1 Dual Power supplies



5.2.2 Single Power supply




SW power is supplied to the sensor connected to the input block. There
is a voltage drop of approximately 1 V max. inside the SI unit when SW
power is supplied. Select a sensor taking this voltage drop into
consideration. If 24 V must be supplied to the sensor, it is necessary
to increase the SW power supply voltage so that the input voltage of
the sensor will be 24 V with the actual load (allowable SW power
supply range: 19.2 V to 28.8 V).



5.3 Ground Terminal


- Connect the ground terminal to ground.
- Individual grounding should be provided close to the product with a short cable to assure the noise resistance of the Fieldbus system.
- Resistance to ground should be 100 ohms or less.



6 Setting

6.1 Switch Setting

- The switches should only be set with the power supply turned OFF.
- Open the cover and set the switches with a small flat blade screwdriver.
 After setting the switches close the cover and tighten the cover screw (tightening torque 0.6 N•m).
- Set the switches before use



6.1.1 Address setting

 The DeviceNet® address (MAC ID) can be set from 0 to 63 (using switch 1 to 6). The factory default setting is 63.

6 Setting (continued)

6.1.2 Communication speed setting

The DeviceNet[®] communication speed can be set to 125, 250 or 500 kbps (using switch 7 and 8). The factory default setting is 125 kbps.

6.1.3 HOLD / CLEAR setting

- Set the reaction of outputs to a communication error (using switch 9)
- . The factory default setting is CLEAR.

6.1.4 HW / SW setting

- Modifications to the address and speed can be made locally (HW mode using switch 10) or over the network (SW mode).
- The factory default setting is "HW mode".

0	HW	Set the address and speed locally using the SI unit switches 1 to 8.
1	SW	Set the address and speed over the DeviceNet® network. (switch setting is invalid).

6.1.5 Setting via the DeviceNet® network

It is possible to set the node address (MAC_ID), DeviceNet® communication speed and output condition when a communication error is generated, via the network, in accordance with the procedure below.

Node Address and Communication speed setting

- 1) Set the switch No. 10 to ON (SW mode).
- Change the instance / attribute value in the DeviceNet[®] Class as follows.

- The MAC ID and communication speed set by SW mode on the SI unit will be saved and still valid after the DeviceNet® has been switched off.
- When DeviceNet® power is applied to the SI unit in HW mode, the MAC ID and communication speed set by Software mode is no longer valid and the switch setting is valid instead.

6.2 Configuration

In order to configure the SI unit for the DeviceNet® network, the appropriate device master file (EDS file) for the SI unit will be required.



*: EX250-SDN1 disconnects the I/O connection when the solenoid valve power supply decreases or when the input block fuse is detected to be broken (EX250-SDN1-X102 does not disconnect the I/O connection).

10 Maintenance

10.1 General Maintenance

⚠ Caution

- Not following proper maintenance procedures could cause the product to malfunction and lead to equipment damage.
- If handled improperly, compressed air can be dangerous.
- Maintenance of pneumatic systems should be performed only by qualified personnel.
- Before performing maintenance, turn off the power supply and be sure to cut off the supply pressure. Confirm that the air is released to atmosphere.
- After installation and maintenance, apply operating pressure and power to the equipment and perform appropriate functional and leakage tests to make sure the equipment is installed correctly.
- If any electrical connections are disturbed during maintenance, ensure they are reconnected correctly and safety checks are carried out as required to ensure continued compliance with applicable national regulations.
- Do not make any modification to the product.
- Do not disassemble the product, unless required by installation or maintenance instructions
- Stop operation if the product does not function correctly.
